The boy caught Sheikh Hamdan's attention with his invention – a prosthetic limb for his father. The Sheikh has taken a special interest in the boy, and hopes the tour that he is sponsoring for Adeeb will give the young inventor more self-confidence and inspire other young Emirati inventors.

Adeeb got the idea for a special kind of prosthetic leg while he was at the beach with his family. His father, who wears an artificial leg, could not swim in the sea as he could not risk getting his leg wet. This inspired Adeeb to invent a waterproof prosthetic leg. However, while he is in Germany, Adeeb will not be spending all his time sightseeing. He will be working with a specialist doctor to build the appendage. Business Studies is a popular choice for students who are choosing a degree course in the UK. After graduating, some go on to further study, but most of them take up employment. Many large companies offer graduate training schemes, which are a kind of apprenticeship. We went to meet twenty - two - year - old Ricky Miles, who is about to graduate in the subject. Ricky has been studying Business Studies, which is a four -year course, including two periods of work experience. Each one lasted six months, but they weren't in the same year. Ricky has studied Maths, Accounting, Finance and Economics, Marketing and Sales over those four years. He also did a course in Management, which is about recruiting and managing staff, and how to deal with conflict.
